Canberra Alpine Club

The Club was formed on 31 July 1934 at the Alpine Hotel, Kiandra and was incorporated on 29 June 1955 (registration number A.19).

The motion to form the Club was put by Tim Ingram and Tom Campbell at a meeting chaired by H.J. Lamble, then Director of the NSW Government Tourist Bureau. The inaugural general meeting was held at the Hotel Canberra on 11 October 1934 to elect office bearers and a committee and to ratify the provisional operating arrangements.

The Club is governed by a written Constitution, By-laws and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*. The present Constitution, which has been subject to minor amendments, was adopted in 1996 and the By-laws are revised annually and circulated each June.

The objects of the Club include promoting snowsports and bushwalking, fostering the conservation of the alpine environment and the interest of members in matters of historical or heritage significance to skiing or bushwalking including the preservation of buildings, sites and objects.

The Club is a corporate member of Snow Australia. The Club is also a member of SLOPES (Ski Lodges of Perisher, Guthega and Smiggins Inc) and of the Kosciuszko Huts Association.

The Mount Franklin Chalet was constructed for the Club in 1938 with bunk accommodation for 32 on leased land. The Chalet reverted to the Government when Namadgi National Park was created in 1984 and was destroyed by bushfires in January 2003, with a new shelter being erected by the ACT Government in 2007. The Mount Franklin precinct is the subject of memoranda of understanding made in 1989 and 1998 between the Club and the ACT Parks and Conservation Service.

The A-frame Perisher lodge was constructed by Club labour in 1961 on land leased from the State of New South Wales. A new lease executed late in 2008 runs until 31 December 2028 – with three 10 year options exercisable after that. This lodge is licensed to accommodate 46 persons and was extended and substantially upgraded in 1983. The bedroom wing was added in 1999, together with wheelchair accessible facilities.

The original Jindabyne lodge was constructed in 1968 on leased land in Banjo Paterson Crescent, adjacent to Lake Jindabyne. Freehold title was acquired in 1992. The original lodge was demolished in late 2013 and a new lodge built, opening in 2014.

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Introduction

This report covers the 2021 calendar year, which coincides with the financial year of the Club. It should be read together with the audited financial statements for the Club’s financial year ending 31 December 2021 which have been published as a supplement.

While the report formally covers the calendar year, some information is also provided regarding events between the beginning of 2022 and preparation of this report.

PART 1 – PRESIDENT’S REPORT

It is my pleasure to report on the operations of the Canberra Alpine Club during the year ending 31st December 2021. This was another challenging year for the Club, as the COVID-19 pandemic continued, and restrictions, lockdowns, and border closures affected all of us. These public health measures also impacted the operations of the Club, particularly for our members based outside of the ACT and Regional NSW, who were essentially restricted from travelling to the lodges for the majority of the winter season. As a Club we are fortunate that the lockdown in the ACT and Regional NSW did not commence until August, as this allowed the Club to continue most operations, and secure important revenue during the peak period.

The Club’s COVID-19 Management Plan remained an essential reference point for the Club’s operations. Four revisions of this plan were published during 2021, as the Committee responded to the evolving risks, health orders, and practical considerations. Many hours of work on the Club’s policy in response to COVID-19 were required from the entire Committee, however I would particularly like to thank Peter Cunningham, the Club’s COVID-19 Officer, for all his hard work in updating and managing the implementation of the COVID-19 Management Plan.

I am extremely pleased to report that even with the sustained lockdowns, the Club has managed to deliver an even better financial result than 2020. In 2021, the Club achieved revenue of \$495k (up from \$360k in 2020) and net profit of \$110k (up from \$82k in 2020). In addition to traditional revenue sources, the Club also secured additional government assistance, which totalled \$45k. In 2021, the Club has also reduced our Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan by a further \$160k and this stood at \$120k at the end of the year. Full details of our financial position are contained in the Treasurer’s report and audited accounts.

With the Club’s healthy financial position, and the Jindabyne Loan almost repaid, it is a great time to be considering our mid to long term capital works program. Input has been sought on this program, with more than 80 responses received to a member survey to help identify priorities. This important topic will also be raised for discussion at the 2022 AGM, and I would like to thank Caroline Walker and Peter Cunningham who have led the Committee’s efforts in this area.

The key expenses of insurance, electricity, rates, and land taxes continued to be an area of focus for the Committee in 2021. We renewed our insurance in 2021 through Barrack Broking, and note that our 2021 premiums increased to \$59k (up from \$33k in 2020). Further increases will occur in 2022, and to ensure that we have adequate

cover, the Committee has arranged an independent valuation of our lodges, which is scheduled to take place in March 2022. In 2021, we have completed the installation of solar panels on the Perisher Lodge, an investment that we expect will significantly reduce our yearly electricity expenses. We also continue our negotiations (via SLOPES - The Ski Lodges Organisation of Perisher Smiggins and Guthega) with the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) on rent relief across both 2020 and 2021 seasons.

Membership has seen a healthy increase, and at end of 2021 was 559 (up from 544 at the end of 2020). The waiting list has also increased to 66 (up from 61 at the end of 2020). It is important that we not only attract new members, but that we also retain existing members where possible. To this end, the Committee has been considering our policies in relation to Youth Retention, and I would like to thank Monika Binder for her efforts in preparing a discussion paper on this topic, which has been published in Frozen Acres and will be discussed at the 2022 Annual General Meeting.

I would also like to pass my condolences on behalf of the Club to the families of the members and former members that passed during 2021. In particular I would like to note the passing of Alan Bain (Gold Member), Althea Routley (aka Margaret Dalheim – Life Member) and James Wallner (Adult Member).

With the cancellations caused by travel restrictions, which effectively closed access to the lodges from all states in mid-August, the number of bed/nights in 2021 still reached 5,255. This is an absolutely outstanding achievement, with an increase of 56% compared to 2020. While this occupancy is not at the same level as the pre-COVID years of 2018-19, it is only 10% down on the average occupancy from 2015-17. For full details of the lodge occupancy, please refer to Appendix 2.

The Committee also remains committed to increasing off-peak lodge utilisation, and has been following the progression of the Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct (SAP) Draft Master Plan, and the Kosciusko National Park Draft Plan of Management. The Committee provided a submission in response to these plans, sharing a perspective on behalf of the Club. In addition, we also provided a submission for the community feedback phase of the draft Kosciusko National Park Wild Horse Heritage Management Plan.

Due to the pandemic, opportunities for in-person social activities were again limited, however it was possible to hold Pre-Season Drinks at The Dock in Kingston. This informal gathering presented an opportunity for Club members, both new and old, to get together, and we had a tremendous turn out for this event. We were also able to

host our regular Family and Youth Weeks at Perisher, and I would like to thank our co-ordinators Mel Randall & Alexis Phillips (Family Week) and Chrissie Young & Caroline Walker (Youth Week) for all their efforts in preparing and running them. Once lockdowns were firmly back in place, we went virtual and hosted a series of *CAC Presents...* virtual sessions, with tales of backcountry skiing in Hokkaido (Bruce Barnett), backcountry splitboarding in Kashmir (Roland Lawrence), and a trip down memory lane with the Franklin Collection (Jenny McLeod)..

While it was disappointing not to be able to hold more in person events, the Committee received very positive feedback following our first “hybrid” AGM. This AGM combined an in-person event at the Canberra Bridge Club, with a Zoom virtual meeting that allowed members outside of Canberra the opportunity to participate without travelling. Given this feedback, and the changes in the relevant legislation, the Committee is further considering how virtual meeting technology can be used more effectively in Club operations in the future.

COVID-19 again impacted the Club’s sporting calendar in 2021. Happily the KAC XC Classic (which also serves as the Club’s XC Championships) was able to proceed, before lockdowns forced the cancellation of other events. While domestic competition was limited, on the international stage, Laura Peel continued her outstanding form to take home the 2021 FIS Freestyle World Championship title. Laura also took home Athlete of the Year at the 2021 Snow Australia Awards, and Women's Sport Athlete of the Year at the 2021 CBR sports awards. She also qualified for her third Winter Olympic games, and was honoured with being named a flag-bearer at the opening ceremony.

Our other international competitor, 16yo Valentino Guseli has also been in outstanding form in 2021, setting a world record for the highest air in a halfpipe (reaching 7.3m), breaking a record set 11 years earlier by Shaun White. Val also won Junior Athlete of the Year at the 2021 Snow Australia Awards. He qualified for his first Winter Olympics, and will no doubt represent Australia in many more events in the coming years.

While restrictions heavily impacted the peak season and snowsports events, during the off-peak we were able to complete a number of work parties, with a particular focus on ongoing maintenance. Work parties were held at Jindabyne, Perisher, Mt Franklin, and O’Keefe’s Hut. We were also able to represent the Club at the annual Snow Australia Snowsports Sale in May.

I would like to thank Perisher Lodge Coordinator Peter Richards, Jindabyne Lodge

Coordinator Peter Cunningham, Franklin Coordinator Jenny McLeod and O'Keefe's Hut Coordinator Paul Obohov for their continued hard work throughout 2021. I would like to thank all the volunteers who attended work parties, and those who served as lodge leaders.

In 2021, we sadly farewelled Sarah Forsdyke, who stepped down as the Club's Administrative Officer in October after 5 years in the role. Sarah has done an amazing job supporting the Club, particularly through the height of pandemic. We wish her all the best as she moves onto her next challenge. With Sarah stepping down, we welcomed Georgia Beyer as our new Administrative Officer. Georgia has settled into the role very quickly, and the Committee is working closely with her to ensure that she can effectively manage the ongoing demands of the role.

The Committee would like to thank Jill and Ken French, who continued their management of Perisher Lodge during Peak season, and provided additional support in relation to cleaning and other requirements. We would also like to again thank Judy Lejins (Editor) and Monika Binder (Assistant Editor) for the 8 editions of Frozen Acres produced during 2021. We would also like to thank Jenny McLeod for creating and distributing 18 Skimail newsletters in 2021.

Finally, I would also like to thank all the Committee for their continued hard work and support over the past year, in particular Jenny McLeod (Secretary), Will Comensoli (Treasurer), and Caroline Walker / Amanda East (Vice-Presidents). 2021 was another challenging year, and the Committee has had to navigate a constantly shifting public health environment, as well as long-term challenges such as capital planning, membership retention, and various draft management plans. As a Club, we are all fortunate to have such a great team, who are willing to volunteer their time to carry out these activities.

PART 2 - OPERATIONS

The Club's operations are directed generally by the Committee, assisted by sub-committees convened by Committee members.

FINANCES (Treasurer: Will Comensoli)

2021 Result

I am pleased to report that the club has concluded the calendar 2021 year with an operating surplus of \$110,269 (2020: \$81,759). The surplus was recorded after providing for depreciation of \$85,865 (2020: \$85,459) and interest of \$4,555 (2020: \$12,359).

The result again reflects the hard work of the committee and membership committing to ensuring that the Club could remain open in a difficult and fast changing environment, plus the luck that the ACT lockdown did not occur until mid-August.

The surplus this year was only in part due to some government assistance. The club received a combined \$45,263 in government support and wage subsidies. I am pleased that the Club was at least able to open for a portion of this year for members.

The year saw the club's operations improve compared to 2020 but not to 2019 peaks. Accommodation revenue for Perisher to \$187,090 (2020: \$118,457 but note 2019: 228,331) and Jindabyne to \$108,133 (2020: \$62,603 but note 2019: 124,321). It would be safe to say that the ACT COVID lockdown probably cost us from having another record year.

Overview of Key Financial Data

Our insurance premiums almost doubled in 2021 to \$59,230 (2020: \$32,726) due to the 2019 bushfires. This was 3.5 times the insurance premiums paid in 2018 and prior years. This cost wipes out our annual subscriptions, causing us to have to rely on good snow seasons and the club having good attendance and bookings to pay our wages, rent and all other expenses.

In other key expenses, the deferrals received in previous years with respect to National Parks Rental Charges \$50,742 (2020: \$16,989) reflecting three payments this year compared to one in 2020 given deferrals.

Cost centre net results, after allowing for depreciation and amortisation of \$85,459 and matching income and expenditure to the applicable year, are presented in the below table:

Balance Sheet

There was a net increase in cash held for the year of \$38,473 as the club continued to seek to firm up its cash position in order to manage the volatility of trading conditions and ensuring provisions were made for accommodation refunds. Cash held at 31 December 2021 was \$224,737 (2020: \$183,431).

Property values are included in the Balance Sheet at cost less accumulated depreciation. At last independent market valuation (24 September 2007) the Perisher property was valued at \$1,920,000. The Jindabyne Lodge is registered on the balance sheet at cost of \$1,434,133 less Accumulated Depreciation of \$230,135. A new valuation is being conducted in 2022.

Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan

The details of the Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan with Westpac bank are (at time of writing this report):

Inclusive of the 1.05% Facility Fee, the total cost of this finance is 3.34%.

We are required to reduce the principle on this loan by \$60,000 per annum going

forward (2019 and prior years: \$91,000 per annum). This changed in June 2020 after executing a refinancing exercise to provide greater financial flexibility given the COVID-19 lockdown, and the clubs strong position with loan repayments heading into COVID-19.

At 31 December 2021 the Club had paid the initial drawdown of \$1m down to \$120,000 (2020: \$280,000), after repayments of \$160,000 (2020: \$140,000).

Auditor

Mr Patrick Salter, Chartered Accountant, has provided an unqualified audit opinion on the Club's 2021 financial report.

Insurance Cover

The principal policies provide the following cover at each of the lodges:

The policy excess amounts are (generally) \$1,000. The policies provide cover to specific sub-limits for accidental damage, burglary, theft, and a range of other risks.

The Club maintains a group accident policy providing limited cover for members and persons attending organised Club work parties and other functions.

Persons representing the Club at sanctioned snow sports events or participating in Club events are generally covered under a policy maintained by Ski and Snowboard Australia. This policy also provides Public Liability cover of \$20,000,000, Professional Indemnity cover of \$2,000,000 and Management Liability cover of \$1,000,000.

The Club maintains a Voluntary Workers insurance policy which, in broad terms, covers members on and travelling to and from working bees. Workers Compensation insurance was maintained for NSW during the year to cover the employees of the Club.

GOVERNANCE (Convenor: Andrew Herring)

General Meeting

The 2021 Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held at the Canberra Bridge Club on Wednesday 24 March 2021, as a hybrid in-person and online meeting. The hybrid format worked well, with 42 attendees in person and another 12 participating via Zoom.

Committee Changes

Caroline Walker was elected as Vice-President at the 2021 AGM, replacing Phil Bell, who did not re-nominate.

Alan Booth was elected as an Ordinary Committee member at the 2021 AGM.

LODGES (Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

For the second year the Covid pandemic caused both lodges to be closed for part of winter

The Lodges were both subject to restricted occupancy numbers in compliance with the one person per 4 sq m rule during the season in accordance with the NSW Public Health Orders. The density limits were relaxed to one person per 2 sq m in October. Density limits were removed for a short two week period in December but the one person per 4 sq m rule was reintroduced on 27 December 2021.

Lodge numbers were severely impacted during the following periods:

- The Greater Sydney lockdown from 23 June to 8 October restricting Sydney and Wollongong based members.

- The NSW General Lockdown which commenced on 14 August for a five week period which stopped all visitors except local regional members who were not subject to Stay at Home Rules.
- The ACT lockdown which commenced on 13 August to 22 October and restricted all ACT members for this full period.

The lodges were not officially closed except for two brief periods in August and September during the Snowy Monaro LGA lockdowns.

The Lodges Committee held three meetings in 2021 (5 May, 20 September and 15 November) and was active in preparing a proposed seven year capital works program.

An online survey was conducted with members in August/September asking their preferences for the future development of Perisher. The results were very useful and have been incorporated into a Capital Works discussion paper to be distributed for consultation to Members in early 2022.

Operational Manuals have been produced for both lodges and are available on the Club's website.

Perisher (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Richards)

Three work parties were conducted during 2021 with a good roll-up of willing hands at each one (27/28 March, 17/18 April and 20/21 November). A weeding party was held on 9/10 January.

The major activities and improvements undertaken at Perisher during 2021 were:

- The installation of a 12.9kW, 32 panel DC solar system on the north facing roof of the bedroom wing. The system was commissioned on Friday 30 April 2021 by Energy Options and has been fully operational since. The PV system's output was mainly self consumed within the lodge over winter but significant export is occurring over the spring/summer period. An analysis of the financial return will be conducted in early 2022 after allowing a sufficient operational period.
- The establishment of an Asset Protection Zone (APZ) around the Perisher Lodge in accordance with the new NPWS environmental and fire regulations. The majority of the snow gums surrounding the lodge had unfortunately died over the last 3 to 4 years because of the longicorn beetle infestation. This meant that the dead trees represented significant fire hazards and the NPWS

recommended their removal. We also had to remove the ground heath in our lease area, generally up to four metres from the building walls. This was completed at the April work party. We are now required to maintain the heath growth below 100mm in the future. We are embarking on a native grass planting program. The identified problem trees were cut down in December by McMahon's Tree Services (Jindabyne) and the cut wood will be removed at the February 2022 work party.

- The refurbishment of the stone wall under the south deck and the south stairs was completed. The wall had considerable decay because of being exposed on its top and subject to many years weathering. The stonemason will now commence refurbishing the south deck wall in early 2022 and it is planned to do the north wall in 2023.
- The installation of a tablet and wi-fi internet which is integrated into the CBDWeb booking system. This is similar to the Jindabyne tablet and allows guests to electronically view their room bookings. The system modem is also integrated into the PV system for remote monitoring. The wifi is not available for general use.
- The waterproofing of the external walls in the bedroom sections of the old wing. A major leak had occurred during 2020 into bedrooms 3 and 4 and the walls on both north and south ends had to be entirely stripped, professionally sand blasted, waterproofed and painted. The drainage in both areas was also overhauled.
- The final stage of the bed upgrade program occurred with the top floor having new mattresses and some beds replaced in November.
- A new two door fridge was installed in April and a new freezer installed in November.
- A new dishwasher was installed in December.
- Ember proof flyscreens were installed in the old wing.

Jindabyne (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Cunningham)

Three working bees were conducted during 2021 – 6/7 February, 1/2 May and 6/7 November and all were well attended.

Because of the Club's decision to restrict capital expenditure to essential projects only normal maintenance activities were primarily conducted. Improvements completed were wall fans installed in the upstairs bedrooms, a rear garden constructed and all gardens tan barked. A major wall leak in the front entry was repaired.

Mount Franklin (Coordinator: Jenny McLeod)

Work parties were held at Mt Franklin in January, April, and November. The April work party had a solid dusting of snow overnight, which set the scene for the ACT Heritage Festival Open Day the following day. The scheduled weekend November work party, due to bad weather, was changed to a one-day mid week work party. Ranger Steph left for West Australia and, later in the year, was replaced by Luke as the ranger responsible for Mt Franklin. The staff changes in ACT P&CS over the last couple of years have made long term planning more difficult, but weeding, clearing of Wombat Walk, the Slalom Run uphill of the Austin, and the area around the shelter, plus a touch of painting, have been enough to keep work parties busy.

O'Keefe's Hut (Coordinator: Paul Oboohov)

The Canberra Day long weekend CAC workparty to O'Keefe's Hut included Sue Attreed, Michael Griffiths, Andrew and Jenny Cupit, Paul Oboohov and a friend of his Arthur Hitchcock (from Cooma). The work done included completing covering the historic 1930s / 1940s newspapers (supplied by NPWS) with 0.8mm perspex plastic; the front and Grey Mare Track facing window frames and putty were painted with repeated applications of wood oil to protect the frames from the harsh elements; the window frame near the rear chimney was painted with Mission Brown coloured paint. The snow shovel was found inside the hut, with its outside wire hook missing, so the latter was refashioned from fencing wire, and the shovel rehung outside and next to the front door, with text written on the shovel and on the outside wall to indicate its purpose. Strong hooks were fixed to some inside walls for hanging heavy backpacks, and smaller hooks also fixed to hang coats. The work built on the successful and large workparty in November 2020. On the Sunday the Cupits, Michael and Sue climbed Mount Jagungal, with Sue leading (she has bushwalked in the area, and climbed the mountain in the 1970's). On this occasion the NPWS paid for all hardware and other materials.

BOOKINGS (Convenor: Jon Wilson)

Lodge Usage

As can be seen from the figures reported in Appendix 2, 2021 was almost a return to usual levels of usage for the Club in terms of bookings, being only 10% down on the average occupancy from 2015-17. This was an amazing result, given the lockdown across Greater Sydney that was in place for virtually the entire peak season, and the lockdown in the ACT and Regional NSW which was in place from mid-August.

We would like to thank all our members, who supported the Club by visiting in both peak and off-peak season in 2021. Lodge utilisation is incredibly important in maintaining the financial viability of the Club, and when our Sydney members were forced to cancel their bookings, it was great that our ACT and Regional NSW members were able to fill the vacancies.

While the pandemic prevented many of us from making the most of it, the snow in 2021 was some of the best in recent years, with early falls, a good deep base, and few crowds on the slopes. Overall the Club recorded 5,255 bed nights across 2021, an increase of 56% on 2020.

Our results stand in stark contrast to many other Perisher Clubs, which saw extremely low levels of occupancy, primarily as the majority of their membership are based in Greater Sydney.

Online System

The Club has now completed its fifth full year of operation with the CBDWeb system as its centralised membership and booking system. We continue to see improvements being rolled out by the developers, and members would now note that bookings can have different arrival and departure dates for each person, making it possible to represent more complex arrangements in a single booking.

In 2021, we transitioned to a digital bunk list at Perisher, using the same system that has successfully been in use at Jindabyne for the past two years. This change means that we no longer need to maintain and print a separate bunk list, as the digital bunk list always has the latest information, drawn directly from the CBDWeb system, and displayed on the tablet in the foyer.

Booking Privileges

A small number of members and guests were granted booking privileges

(complimentary accommodation and early confirmation of Saturday nights) which are approved by the Committee. A list of these is included in Appendix 3.

These privileges are typically extended to the coordinators of lodge events (such as Family and Youth Weeks, and the Brumby and Championship Dinners) as well as members representing the Club during races (e.g. Balmain Cup, Perisher Cup) and participating in Snowsports development programs. As some events and races did not take place in 2021, a number of these booking privileges were not offered.

The Club also supports Nordic Shelter work parties by offering complimentary accommodation to participants. We were proud to be able to continue our support of this community in 2021.

Members of the subcommittee in 2021 were: Jon Wilson, Jenny McLeod, Sarah Forsdyke, and Georgia Beyer.

SNOWSPORTS (Convener: Colleen Turner, Club Captain: Sarah Brake)

Development Grants

The Club actively supports the development of Snowsports by offering development grants and some complimentary accommodation to those who apply and are approved in accordance with the Snowsports guidelines. This process is undertaken by the Snowsports sub-committee. Information on complimentary accommodation and development grants is available on the website.

Articles have been published throughout the season re-capping members experiences of this very different year.

Complimentary Accommodation

When members compete for the Club in events such as Perisher Cup and Balmain Cup they can seek reimbursement for any associated costs (lift tickets, gear hire etc) and also receive complimentary accommodation . These races were not held in 2021.

SOCIAL (Convenors: Mandy Savery/Colleen Turner)

Following on from a very quiet social calendar in 2020, the social side of club life kicked off with a bang with the annual pre-season drinks held on Sunday 16 May at the Dock in Kingston. Members were able to catch up with friends they hadn’t seen for a long time, and everybody enjoyed themselves. Unfortunately, Covid-19 restrictions began to impact social gatherings before any further face-to-face events could be held.

With the inability to meet face-to-face, several members generously volunteered their time to hold Zoom presentations on topics of interest to members. Bruce Barnett kicked off the series in September with a presentation on backcountry and side country skiing in Hokkaido, followed later in the month by a presentation by Roland Lawrence on backcountry split-boarding in Kashmir, and a presentation by Jenny McLeod on The Franklin Collection in October. All presentations were thoroughly enjoyed by the many members in attendance.

Hopefully as the Covid-19 situation continues to ease, we can organise some social events for 2022. As always, the social sub-Committee is super keen for new members to join the fun and help keep the social side of the Club interesting.

MEMBERSHIP (Convenor: Jenny McLeod)

An encouraging increase in membership this year, with a net increase of fifteen members taking it to a total of 559 across all membership categories. There was

some backlog of waiters progressing due to the number of work parties cancelled in 2020 – this is expected to be a contributor to the increase in members compared to 2020. The waiting list also increased, by five to 66 in total. There is still plenty of room for new members, so keep encouraging your interested friends to join.

Statistics on membership numbers are in part 3 of this report.

PUBLIC RELATIONS (Convenor: Jenny McLeod; Frozen Acres editor: Judy Lejins; Assistant Editor: Monika Binder)

Eight copies of Frozen Acres were published during 2021. Towards the end of the year the Committee made a decision to have Frozen Acres published on just a bi-monthly basis. With information often needing to be go out to members with short notice, in particular due to changing circumstances with COVID, this information was able to be made available to members quicker by Skimail. It was also decided that Frozen Acres would concentrate more on magazine style articles while still providing some general information.

As with previous years, former Admin Officer Stella continued to proofread each article, and Asst. Editor, Monika checked the mock-ups from the printer before they were given the OK to go ahead and print. As in previous years FreshCreative continued to print each copy and Jon Wilson to collate and post them out. Emailed copies were

sent out by Jenny McLeod to those members who did not opt to get a hard copy. With the majority of members preferring to receive their copies by email, only 50 needed to be printed for each issue.

Articles and photos sent in by members were much appreciated and these included stories about their cross-country ski and walking tours, family and youth weeks at the Club and work party weekends.

18 Skimails were sent in 2021; once again, many of these Skimails included information about COVID-19 lodge (and Perisher) operating procedures and restrictions throughout the year. They also advertised social gatherings (mainly online!), upcoming events such as races – or their cancellation, and results of members competing overseas, as well as plenty of other information.

The Club's Facebook group, with was another way of providing updates to members, although COVID restrictions at times were changing faster than we could provide updates! It was also used to celebrate achievements and share clips of athletes such as Laura and Val. The group has over 300 members.

Business cards with basic information and contact details for the Club are still available, as are Club logo stickers.

The Club had an information stand at the Snowsports Sale and Expo, which this year ran at EPIC, with plenty of interest from attendees.

The Club's Personal Locator Beacon was borrowed seven times in 2021, for Mt Franklin work parties and for private trips. The PLB is available for loan to any member at no cost for bushwalking, skiing, or other expeditions, in order to improve safety for members on Club or private trips.

STRATEGIC PLANNING (Convener: Will Comensoli)

2021 proved a similar year to 2020 yet with COVID-19 challenges and a continually evolving COVID plan. The Club's strong results again in 2021 were in large part thanks to the ACT lockdown not occurring until 13 August (despite NSW restrictions occurring in late June. As a result, it felt like an "ACT Ski Season" up at the snow for a few weeks there. The luck we had that we managed to have attendance through the school holidays should not be discounted.

Now the Jindabyne loan is almost paid off the Committee has moved its focus towards future works towards upgrading and improving the Perisher lodges facilities. In 2020 we completed a Bed replacement program at Perisher and began works on

replenishing the 40+ year old Stone Walls that are both a feature of the club and a requirement under our National parks lease.

A significant amount of work went into the following initiatives this year:

- Perisher Capital Works Program Survey of Member's Priorities – this feedback is invaluable as we look at options regarding the significant capital works required to the Perisher lodge. (Massive thanks to Caroline Walker for managing this process, drafting and collating responses);
- COVID-19 Management Plan and all its new iterations and changes (thanks to the Committee, in particular Peter Cunningham, Jenny McLeod, Monika Binder and Jon Wilson for their inputs to this this year, and to CAC member Paul Dugdale for his pro-bono expert assistance and advice on the August 2021 restrictions) ; and
- Financial analysis and updates to the Committee on the financial impacts of capacity restraints, government subsidies.

The seventh year of operation of the new Jindabyne Lodge was successful and operated well. Pleasingly the lodge made a small surplus and thus did not eat into member subs, the capital contributions or entrance fees.

The Club's planning emphasis has been on the Jindabyne redevelopment for the past decade. It is very exciting to be moving into a new phase with the club debt free and hopefully accumulating funds for capital works that are required. Note that at the 2017 AGM the membership indicated that their preference was to concentrate on the reduction of the Jindabyne loan debt as quickly as possible to put the Club back on a sound financial footing ahead of future required Perisher Capital works. This is very close to being achieved. The loan has now been reduced from \$1M to \$120k as at 31 December 2021 (2020: \$280k). A Capital Works fund will be setup once the loan is paid off.

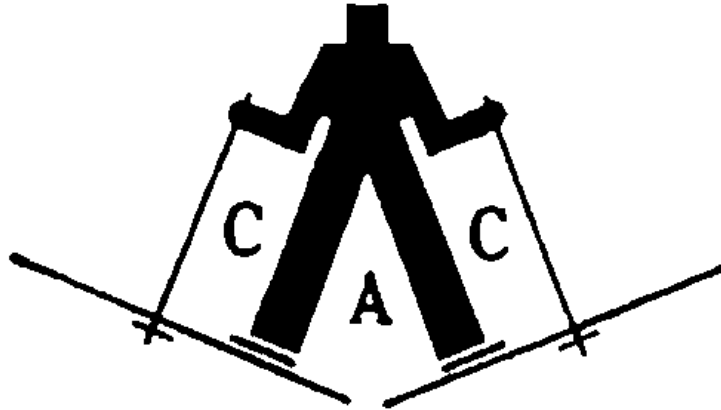

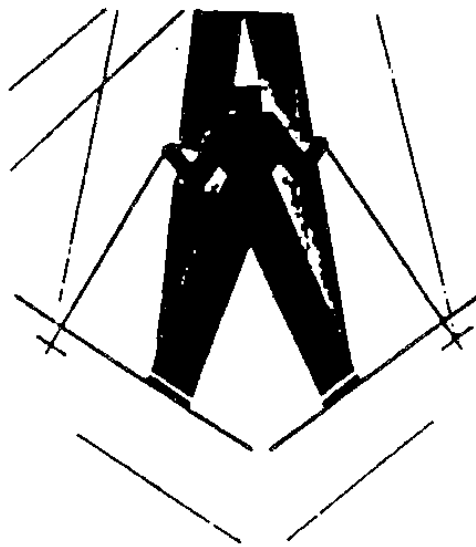

THE CLUB BADGE

The distinctive Club badge is quite unlike the badges of more recently formed ski clubs and is typical of the skiing era in which it was designed.



The original badge design, shown above, appeared in December 1936 on a brochure explaining the objects of the Club 'to the citizens of Canberra'. According to the Club's foundation Treasurer, Mr J.C. Anderson, it was adapted from the design, shown below, which appeared on the dust cover of the 1935 Ski Year Book. That design is attributed to a Mrs de Gruchy, who was said to be a member of the Ski Club of Victoria.



This original design changed after some time to a blue diamond with the skier herring-boning in yellow, thus utilising the then national colours, which have also been those of the Club for many years. These colours were adopted by the Territory upon obtaining self-Government (but ceased to be the national colours in the 1980s when the unofficial sporting colours of green and gold were formally adopted by the Commonwealth).
