## Canberra Alpine Club

The Club was formed on 31 July 1934 at the Alpine Hotel, Kiandra and was incorporated on 29 June 1955 (registration number A.19).

The motion to form the Club was put by Tim Ingram and Tom Campbell at a meeting chaired by H.J. Lamble, then Director of the NSW Government Tourist Bureau. The inaugural general meeting was held at the Hotel Canberra on 11 October 1934 to elect office bearers and a committee and to ratify the provisional operating arrangements.

The Club is governed by a written Constitution, By-laws and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*. The present Constitution, which has been subject to minor amendments, was adopted in 1996 and the By-laws are revised annually and circulated each June.

The objects of the Club include promoting snowsports and bushwalking, fostering the conservation of the alpine environment and the interest of members in matters of historical or heritage significance to skiing or bushwalking including the preservation of buildings, sites and objects.

The Club is a corporate member of Snowsports ACT. The Club is also a member of SLOPES (Ski Lodges of Perisher, Guthega and Smiggins Inc) and of the Kosciuszko Huts Association.

The Mount Franklin Chalet was constructed for the Club in 1938 with bunk accommodation for 32 on leased land. The Chalet reverted to the Government when Namadgi National Park was created in 1984 and was destroyed by bushfires in January 2003, with a new shelter being erected by the ACT Government in 2007. The Mount Franklin precinct is the subject of memoranda of understanding made in 1989 and 1998 between the Club and the ACT Parks and Conservation Service.

The A-frame Perisher lodge was constructed by Club labour in 1961 on land leased from the State of New South Wales. A new lease executed late in 2008 runs until 31 December 2028 – with three 10 year options exercisable after that. This lodge is licensed to accommodate 46 persons and was extended and substantially upgraded in 1983. The bedroom wing was added in 1999, together with wheelchair accessible facilities.

The original Jindabyne lodge was constructed in 1968 on leased land in Banjo Paterson Crescent, adjacent to Lake Jindabyne. Freehold title was acquired in 1992. The original lodge was demolished in late 2013 and a new lodge built, opening in 2014.

## **Introduction**

This report covers the 2018 calendar year, which coincides with the financial year of the Club. It should be read together with the audited financial statements for the Club's financial year ending 31 December 2018 which have been published as a supplement.

While the report formally covers the calendar year, some information is also provided regarding events between the beginning of 2019 and preparation of this report.

## **PART 1 – PRESIDENT’S REPORT**

It is my pleasure to report on the operations of the Canberra Alpine Club during the year ending 31st December 2018.

I am pleased to report that the Club has delivered another strong financial result in 2018. After another excellent snow season, the annual result was a surplus of almost \$90k. While slightly lower than the 2017 result, this is still a very healthy surplus, and puts the Club in a strong position for 2019. Importantly, we continue to make significant reductions to our Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan, which now stands at \$550k (reduced from \$1M in four years). Full details of our financial position are contained in the Treasurer’s report and audited accounts.

Membership at the end of 2018 was 538 (of the maximum of 600 allowed by constitution), with a waiting list of 64. Both of these numbers are increased from 2017, and it is pleasing to see a reversal in the trend of declining membership numbers, combined with so many new nominations in 2018. The ability to attract and retain members is vital to the long-term success of the Club, and this will continue to be a key focus for the committee.

Lodge bookings reached an all-time high in 2018, with over 6,500 bed / nights in total (an increase of 9% on 2017 levels). It was particularly pleasing to see excellent occupancy in both peak and off-peak periods, across both lodges, which were close to capacity throughout the peak season. Please refer to Appendix 2 for further details.

A number of social events were held during the year in Canberra and at the lodges. These included the Pre-Season Cocktail Party held at Vertikal Indoor Snow Sports, and the Club Championship Dinner and Brumby Cup Dinner, both held at the Perisher Lodge. The Annual Dinner and Trophy Presentation was held at Gryphons in Griffith in October and was yet another very successful night.

The Club sporting calendar was again full with Brumby Races, XC Championships, Balmain Cup and Perisher Cup, not to mention Interschools Races, ACT Schools Cup, Youth Week and Family Week. Congratulations to all the competitors who participated in these events, particularly the Club Juniors who achieved fantastic results in Interschools and ACT Schools Cup (see Snowsports report for details). Well done to the Balmain Cup team, who achieved second place in this year’s competition. It was also particularly pleasing that in 2018 the Club was able to enter

two teams in the Perisher Cup (after not entering a team for the last two years). It was worth the wait, with the teams achieving great results, achieving 3<sup>rd</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> places.

Outside of Australian competition, we were very excited to see performances from Laura Peel, who achieved an outstanding result of 5<sup>th</sup> in the Aerials Finals in the PyeongChang Winter Olympics at the start of 2018, and was nominated for the 2018 Athlete of the Year at the 2018 Australian Ski and Snowboard Awards in May. Valentino Guseli also had an amazing year on the international circuit, placing first overall in his age group for the 4<sup>th</sup> year running, and winning the Rising Star award at the 2018 Australian Ski and Snowboard Awards. Congratulations to both of you for your fantastic results in 2018, you are both great ambassadors for the Club.

Work parties were conducted throughout the year to continue our important maintenance programs at Jindabyne, Perisher, Mt Franklin and O'Keefes Hut. In particular, this included completing a significant program of work at the Perisher Lodge (required to comply with the 2007 Fire Order), along with the second set of stairs from the Manager's flat down to the second level. Completing this work was extremely important, as the Perisher Lodge could have been closed for Winter otherwise. In particular, I would like to thank Peter Richards (recipient of this year's Lane-Poole Trophy) as well as Amanda East, Peter Cunningham, and Sam de Lorenzo for their hard work and commitment in getting these activities completed before the NSW Department of Planning deadline, and ensuring that the Perisher Lodge remained available to members during the peak season.

I would also like to thank Club Captain Kristen Guseli, Perisher Lodge Coordinator Peter Richards, Jindabyne Lodge Coordinator Peter Cunningham, Franklin Coordinator Ian McLeod and O'Keefe's Hut Coordinator Paul Obohov for their continued hard work throughout 2018. In addition, I would like to thank all the volunteers who attended work parties, as well as those who have volunteered as social and sporting event organisers, and as lodge leaders.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank our Administrative Officer, Sarah Forsdyke, who has continued to ensure our bookings and membership functions proceed smoothly, along with providing informal snow reports via the Club's Facebook page. I would also like to thank Jill and Ken French for their ongoing management of Perisher Lodge during Peak season. I would also like to make a special thanks to Judy Lejins who, as Editor of Frozen Acres, is forced to chase many of us (and myself in particular) for our contributions to Frozen Acres. Your hard work is very much appreciated.

I would also like to thank the Committee for their support over the past year. While we have had some heated debates at times, and have addressed some challenging issues, we have worked very well together, with the common goal of improving the Club for all members. I would like to thank both Allister Polkinghorne and Mark King who have advised that they will be stepping down from the committee at the next AGM. I would like to make particular note of Mark King's contribution in the role of Treasurer, a role he has been in since 2011, during which time he has provided a vital service to the club.

I have nominated to continue in the role of President for the next year, and I hope that in this role that I am able to continue to support the long-term development and success of the Club.

## **PART 2 - OPERATIONS**

The Club's operations are directed generally by the Committee, assisted by sub-committees and working groups convened by Committee members or interested members.

### **FINANCES**

(Treasurer: Mark King)

#### *2018 Result*

It is pleasing to once again report that good snowfall has provided a good financial result.

Cost Centre net results, after allowing for depreciation and amortisation expenses of \$75,500 and matching income and expenditure to the applicable year, were:

(The Club recorded a Net Profit of \$97,806 for the 2017 year.)

#### *Capital Contributions and Entrance Fees*

The contribution to the net result from Capital Contributions and Entrance Fees continues to remain critical to the Club's financial performance and its ability to pay down the Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan. For 2018 these totalled \$110,264.

#### *Trading*

Total income attributable to the Administration cost centre was \$55,976 comprising subscriptions of \$54,006, interest income of \$107, cancellation fees and sundry other income of \$1,863.

The administrative expenses of the Club for the year were \$47,022 with major items of expenditure being the Club's Administration Officer wages proportion of \$9,227,



Frozen Acres production and distribution costs of \$7,204, audit and bank fees of \$8,401, and Booking System running costs of \$5,947. The Club contributed \$6,659 to ski development and training programs for its members throughout the year.

Perisher total receipts were \$208,404 and did not cover the running costs of this lodge. This was due in large part to the accrual at year end of a \$35,535 final electricity invoice from Origin Energy. Origin had been estimating the meter readings for most of the year and much of the previous year.

Refer to the Balance Sheet section below for the Fire Upgrade costs for the Perisher Lodge.

Jindabyne accommodation receipts contributed income of \$113,368. Expenses were \$118,987 inclusive of Loan Interest of \$26,616, the Loan Line Fee of \$8,743 and Building Depreciation of \$42,784.

### *Balance Sheet*

There was a net decrease in cash held for the year of \$21,682. Cash held at 31 December 2018 was \$134,349.

Property values are included in the Balance Sheet at cost less accumulated depreciation. At last independent market valuation (24 September 2007) the Perisher property was valued at \$1,920,000. The Jindabyne Lodge is in the accounts at \$1,434,133 less Accumulated Depreciation of \$158,428.

Costs for the Perisher Fire Upgrade are captured on the Balance Sheet and total \$87,653. This building work is being depreciated over the next 40 years.

### *Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan*

The details of the Jindabyne redevelopment loan with Westpac bank are (at time of writing this report):

Inclusive of the 1.05% Facility Fee, the total cost of this finance is 4.43%.

We are required to reduce the principle on this loan by \$91,000 per annum.

At 31 December 2018 the Club had paid the initial drawdown of \$1m down to \$550,000.

#### *Auditor*

Mr Patrick Salter, Chartered Accountant, has provided an unqualified audit opinion on the Club's 2018 financial report.

#### *Insurance Cover*

The principal policies provide the following cover at each of the lodges:

The policy excess amounts are (generally) \$1,000. The policies provide cover to specific sub-limits for accidental damage, burglary, theft, and a range of other risks.

The Club maintains a group accident policy providing limited cover for members and persons attending organised Club work parties and other functions.

Persons representing the Club at sanctioned snow sports events or participating in Club events are generally covered under a policy maintained by Ski and Snowboard Australia. This policy also provides Public Liability cover of \$20,000,000, Professional Indemnity cover of \$2,000,000 and Management Liability cover of \$1,000,000.

The Club maintains a Voluntary Workers insurance policy which, in broad terms, covers members on and travelling to working bees.

Workers Compensation insurance was maintained for NSW during the year to cover employees of the Club.

#### *Committee Changes*

Margaret Mahoney was elected to a vacant ordinary Committee position on 12 February.

Denelda Bolt, Judy Lejins, and Fran Sanders retired at the 2018 AGM.

At the close of the 2018 AGM one vice-president position and one ordinary Committee position remained unfilled. On 9 April, Allister Polkinghorne was elected by the Committee to the vacant Vice-President position, and Colleen Turner was co-opted to the vacant ordinary Committee position. This left one vacant ordinary Committee position which remained unfilled.

#### **LODGES**

(Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

*Perisher* (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Richards)

The year 2018 was pivotal for the Perisher Lodge. The NSW Department of Planning (NSW Planning) issued a Fire Notice on 11 April where we were required to comply

with all the final 2007 Fire Order outstanding issues. The Fire Order also incorporated our plans to install a second set of stairs from the Manager's flat down to the second level plus remove the column from the basement central room. The initial Order completion date was 30 May however this was adjusted after our appeal to the more realistic date of 30 June. It was an extremely tight program as we had limited time to re-appoint a builder, organise materials and complete all the work by the due date.

The project had had a false start in early 2018 when we misunderstood the NSW Planning process. After a Fire Safety Engineer's design and fire report was completed by J2 Fire Safety Engineers in November 2017 we appointed a builder (Ecoseal) who commenced work in January. However after commencing work we were ordered to cease work by NSW Planning as they wanted to consolidate all outstanding activities and had concerns with the Fire Report. We then worked through the issues with NSW Planning over the next two months and this resulted in their Fire Order on 11 April.

After the appointment of a new builder (Mick Hudson), as the initial builder was unavailable, the majority of the outstanding work was completed by mid-June, just beating the snow. This was in accordance with the Fire Order deadline. The builder returned to finish some minor plastering in October and will be completing the basement beam installation and pole removal before the 2019 winter.

The works completed were:

- Installation of a new internal stairwell to the Manager's flat, constructed from the southern end of the flat into the loft of bedroom 1 and from there access into the locker area.
- The lockers were re-arranged and the locker area store relocated to the loft of bedroom 2. The bedroom 2 loft was closed off to accommodate the new store.
- A mezzanine floor was installed above bedroom 1 and its stairs removed.
- The area above the bedroom 1 mezzanine is now a large, useful store room for the Manager's flat.
- Installation of fire rated plaster between the mid-level (kitchen & lounge level) and the Manager's flat to achieve full fire separation.
- Installation of a fire sprinkler system in the basement.
- Completion of all outstanding fire rating projects required under the 2007 Fire Order.
- Expansion of the manager's flat by pushing back the flat's western walls (by 600mm to 1500mm) into the old void. This gained a very large amount of extra room

space and has considerably improved the utility of the flat. The kitchen was also re-arranged.

- Plaster relining of the existing manager's flat access stairwell.

Compliance with the Fire Order was a very serious matter and had to be achieved by the due date as it would have been very likely that NSW Planning may have closed the lodge until full compliance was achieved. This would have totally disrupted our 2018 winter and caused the cancellation of all Member's bookings. Because the Fire Order and construction timing was so late, finding alternative accommodation would have been problematic.

The whole exercise took over a year and had been a particularly frustrating time because of the slowness of dealing with the fire safety engineers, liaising and negotiating with NSW Planning, finalising the designs and required modifications, securing builders and tradesmen at short notice and organising the required materials. The Lodges sub-committee handled the project and many thanks must be given to Amanda East, Peter Cunningham, Sam de Lorenzo and particular credit must be given to Peter Richards who gave up a lot of his time to project manage on-site over seven weeks.

The NSW Planning Fire Order, while onerous, was the catalyst for a combined project with our lodge improvement plans to produce a more functional and safer lodge.

The 2017 AGM had endorsed the expenditure of \$55K to complete all the outstanding work, the final expenditure was \$87K.

Simultaneously on 12 April, NSW Planning also issued a Notice of intention to issue an order - External Wall Cladding. This required us to undertake a Fire Safety Engineers investigation of the external cladding of the Perisher Lodge for compliance with the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979. Most, if not all lodges in Perisher and Smiggin Holes were issued with similar notices. These Notices were the end result of the fire prone cladding issues that had resulted in major fires in Australia and overseas.

The target date was 22 June which was a very tight timetable. We engaged Fire Engineers AED who produced a report – Building Code of Australia Facade Compliance Assessment which reported our full compliance. The report was submitted to NSW Planning in late June.

In parallel, normal work parties did proceed with a good roll-up of willing hands at each of the four work parties held during 2018 (10/11 February, 3/4 March, 7/8 April and 10/11 November), these included members, waiters, friends and children who undertook the various tasks at hand.

A major incident during winter was the breaking of a flexible water pipe in the ground floor bathroom in the new wing. This caused extensive damage to the hallway carpets and caused the underfloor heating zone in that area to be taken out of service for the remainder of winter until it dried out and could be safely operated again. Many thanks to Ken French who did temporary repairs and cleaned up the damage. All plumbing flexible leads have now been replaced and the carpet was replaced on 15<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

Other work carried out during the year included general maintenance, painting, general cleaning, checking bedding, replacing pillows, bed lamps and globes as needed, removing exotic plants from our lease and the purchase of new items. No major projects were completed during the year except the Fire Order work.

The future Perisher capital works program tendered at the 2017 AGM will progress when finances allow and after consultation with Members as to their priorities. The extension of the dining room has been previously highlighted by Members as the first preferred project.

*Jindabyne (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Cunningham)*

Two working bees were conducted during 2018 - 17/18 February and 3/4 November. Both work parties were very successful and well attended.

Besides the normal maintenance activities and lodge upkeep the major projects completed were:

- Retaining walls built on east and west sides, tan bark installed.
- Garden area created on west side.
- Completed the new end parking bay by erecting timber retaining wall and replacing granite rocks.
- New drying rack installed.
- New dryer installed
- The front driveway was concrete ground at the top to increase the vehicle clearance distance. This will benefit the many low and normal cars that have had access troubles since the new driveway was constructed in 2014.

- Car stops were installed in the car park to assist drivers when parking, particularly against the rock wall.
- An extra car spot was created on the north side by realigning the car spaces. We now have increased the car parking from 11 to 13 car parks.
- A bin wall was erected on Banjo Paterson street, this doubles as a driveway guide.
- All bedroom window shades stripped and painted. The next stage will to have them protected by metal colourbond.

Major projects planned for 2019 are to install a lockable bike shelter, installation of a front retaining wall at the bottom of the driveway and continued investigation of a permanent decking awning.

Members should be aware that a couple of years ago the upstairs lounge area was dedicated to our two-time Olympian Laura Peel. A plaque has been relocated to the top of the stairs to highlight this. We are very proud of Laura's achievements and the room dedication is a very appropriate way to recognise her international sporting achievements.

#### *Mount Franklin (Coordinator: Ian McLeod)*

Three work parties were held during the year; one, on 21 April, before the Canberra and Region Heritage Festival, the others on 20-21 January and 10-11 November. Most of the work was vegetation control. The April work party also replaced the frost-shattered bricks marking the footprint of the chalet and split and stacked in the shelter the load of firewood left by the ranger. For variety, the group walked to Ginini Flats, a Ramsar site (migratory birds and corroboree frogs) northwest of Mount Ginini on 11 November. Despite showery weather, the open day saw about 25 visitors; these included four members of the Franklin family of Brindabella fame.

A group making a documentary film of Namadgi National Park filmed activities at the January work party and on 21 December filmed lengthy interviews of several club members about their Mount Franklin experiences.

#### *O'Keefe's Hut (Coordinator: Paul Oboohov)*

Members Paul Oboohov, Kathy Saw, Patrick See and Helen Jennings participated in an O'Keefe's Hut workparty on 10 to 12 March 2018. Work done included replacing a broken window pane with a new one in the main room; wallpapered 1930's newspapers to the back room walls and fixed perspex sheets over them with screws;



sanded and scraped old paint from the rear door, applying undercoat and Solarguard paint; and collected a supply of wood. On Sunday 11th March we climbed to the alpine grass on Mt Jagungal, near the weather station, on a creek found to be navigable through the scrub, after analysing Google Earth imagery and using a handheld navigation device.

## **BOOKINGS**

(Convenor: Jon Wilson)

### *Lodge Usage*

As can be seen from the figures reported in Appendix 2, 2018 was another excellent year for the club in terms of bookings. Total bookings exceeded 6,500 bed / nights across both lodges, representing growth of more than 9%, and setting yet another new record for the club. This growth was particularly remarkable, as some areas of the Perisher Lodge were unavailable in the first half of the year, due to the works required to comply with the 2007 Fire Order (see Lodges report for more details).

While usage of the Perisher Lodge remained largely consistent with previous years, the growth in bookings was driven by the Jindabyne Lodge, which recorded just over 2,900 bed / nights (almost a 30% increase on 2017 levels). It was great to see significant off-peak usage, and this is a trend that the Bookings sub-committee will look to encourage.

With excellent snowfall early in the season, and regular top-ups throughout, 2018 provided a fantastic Winter season. It was also encouraging to see plenty of periods, outside of peak weekends when the lodges were either at, or very near, capacity.

For a comprehensive summary of bookings information for this year, and comparison with previous years, please refer to Appendix 2 of the report.

### *Online System*

The club has now completed its second full year of operation with the CBDWeb system as its centralised membership and booking system. The feedback on the system continues to be very positive. Most feedback centres of the ability to see forward booking levels, and that the system makes booking and paying very easy.

We note that during 2018, CBDWeb have started to introduce a new design which will make the system even easier to use, particularly on phones and tablets. Most

changes currently only affect administrative areas of the system, however we hope to see member areas also being updated in 2019.

If you have any feedback that you would like to share about the online system, please feel free to contact the Admin Officer.

### *Booking Privileges*

A number of members and guests were granted booking privileges (complimentary accommodation and early confirmation of Saturday nights) which are approved by the committee. A list of these is included in Appendix 3.

These privileges are extended to the coordinators of lodge events (such as Family and Youth Weeks, and the Brumby and Championship Dinners) as well as members representing the club during races (e.g. Balmain Cup, Perisher Cup) and participating in Snowsports development programs. The club highly values all of these contributions, and these privileges represent a small “Thank You” from the club for the contribution that these members and guest have made.

The club also continued to support Nordic Shelter work parties by offering complimentary accommodation to participants at a number of these events in 2018. We are proud to support this group, who have objectives which are closely aligned with those of the club.

## **SNOWSPORTS**

(Convener: Colleen Turner, Club Captain: Kristen Guseli)

The club actively supports the development of Snowsports by offering development grants and some complimentary accommodation to those who apply and are approved in accordance with the Snowsports guidelines. This process is undertaken by the Snowsports sub-committee.

The 2018 Winter Olympics in PyeongChang, South Korea, saw club member Laura Peel finish with an outstanding 5th in the Aerials finals. Many members were glued to the late night Olympic television broadcasts of Laura’s performance, cheering her on from Australia. Her parents Teresa and Bill, and several Club members travelled especially to watch her compete in South Korea. Prior to the Olympics she won back

to back to bronze at Lake Placid World Cup. In 2019 so far, she has won gold at the first Europa Cup in Finland, silver at the US Nationals, came 4th at the World Championships, and won silver at the Moscow World Cup.

Well done Laura, your club is very proud of you.

Valentino Guseli also had a good year internationally, taking out USA National Age Champion for the 4th year, and a 2nd in the US Open Junior Jam, qualifying for the men's final and coming in at 22nd. More recently he has competed in his first junior World Championships in Half Pipe, and was the youngest to make the finals, finishing up in 10th.

Both received nominations for the Ski and Snowboard Australia Awards held in Melbourne in May; Laura was nominated for 2018 - Athlete of the Year, and Valentino - 2018 Junior Athlete of the Year and Rising Star, taking home the Rising Star award. Alex Bell also attended the awards night with other Club members and was happy to collect the School of the Year award on behalf of Canberra Grammar School.

Many junior Club members compete in the Interschools Competitions throughout the Winter and when the Nationals are hosted at Perisher it is especially good fun.

### *Club races and events*

Several wait-listers attended and enjoyed the opportunity to meet members before the season kicked off. It was great to see so many Junior members in attendance.

During the season, two social events were held at Perisher, the Club Championship Dinner on 11 August and the Brumby Cup Dinner on 28 July. The Club Championship dinner was ably organised by Amanda East and was enjoyed by all. The Brumby Cup Dinner was catered by HQ Cuisine based in Cooma. Everyone had a great time and there was certainly plenty of lovely food. Feedback from those who attended was very positive. Thanks go to Amanda East for the Club Championship Dinner and Melissa Randall who took over the delivery aspects of the Brumby Cup Dinner.

The Annual Presentation Dinner was held on 27 October at Gryphons in Griffith. Members who attended really enjoyed the evening and the chance to mingle.

## **PUBLIC RELATIONS**

(Convenor: Jenny McLeod; Frozen Acres editor: Judy Lejins; Assistant Editor: Monika Binder)

External advertising continues to provide focussed face to face, often informal information on the Club. Business cards with contact details for the Club continue to be well used – pick some up from the lodges, or contact the Admin Officer or Secretary; quite a few members have kept a couple in their pocket and found them useful when talking to people on lifts who are interested in joining a club. This has directly led to several new members. The Club's stall at the Snowsports ACT Ski and Snowboard Sale and Expo generated several membership queries. A batch of Club logo stickers printed late in 2017 were snapped up by members for use on skis, boards, helmets and elsewhere.

During 2018 we published nine issues of Frozen Acres. As previously, Stella McLaughlin proofread most items. FreshCreative printed the issues, Jon Wilson batched and posted them and Jenny McLeod arranged distribution to those members who receive them online. Monika Binder, assistant editor, wrote a number of interesting articles, all of which were accompanied by photographs, relating to the various ski tours she had undertaken throughout the year in Australia and overseas. Other members also sent in articles recounting their skiing and hiking trips. Readers found these articles most interesting and informative. Other items published included race results, juniors' pages, announcement of coming events and letters to the editor.

Thanks go to all those who contributed articles or helped in other ways with the production and distribution of Frozen Acres.

20 *Skimail* emails were sent in 2018, including urgent updates such as short notice work parties, registration information for Club races, and unfortunately, funeral information, as well as more routine information on NPWS activities and other events. The Club's Facebook group has reached 250 members, including some people who are not CAC members but have expressed an interest in the Club, or are ex-members. Members shared information and photos on ski technology, Perisher conditions, work parties, social events, race photos and results, and of course plenty of photos of members enjoying skiing and snowboarding.

The Club website was updated during the year with Club race results and other information.

The Club's Personal Locator Beacon was borrowed seven times in 2018, with two loans for Club events and five for private trips. The PLB is available for loan to any member at no cost for bushwalking, skiing, or other expeditions, in order to improve safety for members on Club or private trips.

## **STRATEGIC PLANNING**

(Convener: Allister Polkinghorne)

The Strategic Planning sub-committee continued the process of producing a ten (10) year strategic plan which will encompass all future lodge development as its central focuses. It plans to issue a discussion report during 2019.

The fourth year of operation of the new Jindabyne Lodge was successful and again with positive feedback from all users. Booking numbers and revenue were in excess of the original projections which is very satisfying. The low interest rate on our Westpac loan facility has further benefited the Club's financial position and enabled us to be ahead of our planned loan reduction target.

The Club's planning emphasis has been on the Jindabyne redevelopment for the past 5 to 10 years. At the 2017 AGM the membership indicated that their preferences moving forward for the next few years was to concentrate on the reduction of the Jindabyne loan debt as quickly as possible to put the Club back on a sound financial footing. The loan has now been reduced from \$1M to \$495k as at January 2019.

The future planned Perisher Capital works program will encompass major projects such as the extension of the dining room into the rebuilt southern deck (stage 1 completed in 2013 with the decking rebuild), refurbishment of the basement, refurbishment of the old wing bedrooms, possible installation of ensuites in the new wing lower bedrooms (plumbing and wall layout pre-installed in original construction) and a number of other smaller projects.

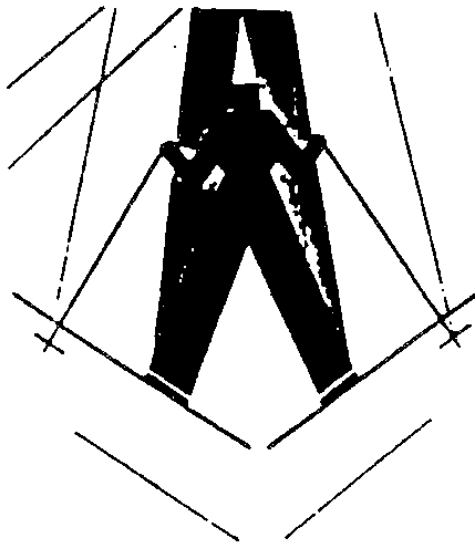

## THE CLUB BADGE

The distinctive Club badge is quite unlike the badges of more recently formed ski clubs and is typical of the skiing era in which it was designed.



The original badge design, shown above, appeared in December 1936 on a brochure explaining the objects of the Club 'to the citizens of Canberra'. According to the Club's foundation Treasurer, Mr J.C. Anderson, it was adapted from the design, shown below, which appeared on the dust cover of the 1935 Ski Year Book. That design is attributed to a Mrs de Gruchy, who was said to be a member of the Ski Club of Victoria.



This original design changed after some time to a blue diamond with the skier herring-boning in yellow, thus utilising the then national colours, which have also been those of the Club for many years. These colours were adopted by the Territory upon obtaining self-Government (but ceased to be the national colours in the 1980s when the unofficial sporting colours of green and gold were formally adopted by the Commonwealth).
