Canberra Alpine Club

The Club was formed on 31 July 1934 at the Alpine Hotel, Kiandra and was incorporated on 29 June 1955 (registration number A.19).

The motion to form the Club was put by Tim Ingram and Tom Campbell at a meeting chaired by H.J. Lamble, then Director of the NSW Government Tourist Bureau. The inaugural general meeting was held at the Hotel Canberra on 11 October 1934 to elect office bearers and a committee and to ratify the provisional operating arrangements.

The Club is governed by a written Constitution, By-laws and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*. The present Constitution, which has been subject to minor amendments, was adopted in 1996 and the By-laws are revised annually and circulated each June.

The objects of the Club include promoting snowsports and bushwalking, fostering the conservation of the alpine environment and the interest of members in matters of historical or heritage significance to skiing or bushwalking including the preservation of buildings, sites and objects.

The Club is a corporate member of Snow Australia. The Club is also a member of SLOPES (Ski Lodges of Perisher, Guthega and Smiggins Inc) and of the Kosciuszko Huts Association.

The Mount Franklin Chalet was constructed for the Club in 1938 with bunk accommodation for 32 on leased land. The Chalet reverted to the Government when Namadgi National Park was created in 1984 and was destroyed by bushfires in January 2003, with a new shelter being erected by the ACT Government in 2007. The Mount Franklin precinct is the subject of memoranda of understanding made in 1989 and 1998 between the Club and the ACT Parks and Conservation Service.

The A-frame Perisher lodge was constructed by Club labour in 1961 on land leased from the State of New South Wales. A new lease executed late in 2008 runs until 31 December 2028 – with three 10 year options exercisable after that. This lodge is licensed to accommodate 46 persons and was extended and substantially upgraded in 1983. The bedroom wing was added in 1999, together with wheelchair accessible facilities.

The original Jindabyne lodge was constructed in 1968 on leased land in Banjo Paterson Crescent, adjacent to Lake Jindabyne. Freehold title was acquired in 1992. The original lodge was demolished in late 2013 and a new lodge built, opening in 2014.

Introduction

This report covers the 2022 calendar year, which coincides with the financial year of the Club. It should be read together with the audited financial statements for the Club’s financial year ending 31 December 2022 which have been published as a supplement.

While the report formally covers the calendar year, some information is also provided regarding events between the beginning of 2023 and preparation of this report.

PART 1 – PRESIDENT’S REPORT

I am pleased to report on the operations of the Canberra Alpine Club for the year ending 31 December 2022.

The Club has done outstandingly well, achieving revenue of \$767k, up from \$495k in 2021 and net profit of \$323k, up from \$110k in 2021. The Jindabyne Redevelopment loan has been reduced to \$5k and money is now being set aside in a sinking fund to pay for the planned redevelopment of the Perisher lodge in coming years. Bed nights occupied in 2022 reached a record 9590, reflecting both the good winter, with early and late snowfalls, and increased summer usage. Full details of the Club’s financial position are contained in the Treasurer’s report and audited accounts.

Membership has increased significantly in 2022 to 576, up from 559 at the end of 2021. The waiting list has also increased to 101, up from 66 at the end of 2021. Membership is likely to reach the Constitutional cap of 600 during the course of 2023 which means that those on the waiting list may not be able to progress to membership as soon as they acquire the required number of points. The number of out of area members is also close to the Constitutional limit of one third which may further delay out of area waitlisters from progressing to membership.

With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions, a number of social activities and snowsports events made a welcome return to the Club calendar in 2022. Pre-season drinks were held in May at the Kingston Hotel and a post season presentation event was held in October at Corroboree Park. The Club Alpine and Snowboard Championships and XC Championships were also held during the season with a social pre dinner event held following the XC Championships. The Club also fielded teams in the Balmain and Perisher Cups which were held for the first time since 2019. Many thanks to social convenor Cheryl Taylor, snowsports convenor Miriam Rihani and Club Captain Sarah Brake and for their contributions in organising these events. Youth and Family weeks in the school holidays were also able to go ahead in 2022 and I would like to record my thanks to organisers Melissa Randall and Gavin Fox and Chrissie and Ben Young.

Georgia Beyer resigned as Admin Officer in March 2022 due to her other work and study commitments and we wish her well in these endeavours. After running a selection process in which we received a large number of strong applications, we were delighted to welcome Vicki Hughes to the position in May. Vicki has done an outstanding job in her first 7 months in the role and we look forward to her taking on additional responsibilities in relation to coordinating purchases and cleaning for Jindabyne lodge in 2023.

COVID-19 still presented issues for the Club in 2022, with a number of members having to cancel or shorten bookings over the course of the year as a result of contracting the virus or being a close contact. The Club's COVID-19 Management Plan was invaluable in helping our Admin Officer, the Committee and members navigate situations as they arose and I would like to thank everyone involved in the development of the plan dating back to early 2020. Special thanks to Vicki for all her efforts contacting affected members and to Peter Cunningham in his role as the Club's COVID-19 Officer.

As flagged in last year's report, a valuation of the Club's lodges was undertaken during 2022. The Perisher lodge has been valued at \$7.3 million and the Jindabyne lodge \$2.7 million. The significantly higher valuations have resulted in the Club's insurance premiums rising to nearly \$94k for 2023, up from \$77k in 2022.

Solid progress has been made in 2022 with respect to planning for the Perisher lodge redevelopment. A Capital Works subcommittee chaired by Peter Cunningham has been established and I would like to thank all members for their contributions, especially Lexi Phillips for her work preparing various concept plans for the proposed basement refurbishment and chairing member forums and Amanda East, Sam DeLorenzo and Peter Cunningham for their efforts in engaging consultants to take the work forward. While the intention remains to commence building work as soon as possible, this is subject to the necessary approvals from club members and various authorities being in place.

A branding strategy has also been developed during 2022, including a new logo concept, with work also being undertaken on a new website. I would like to thank Jeremy Lucas and Gina Quadraccia for their efforts on this project.

The Beijing Winter Olympics were held in February 2022 and the Club was proud to have members Valentino Guseli and Laura Peel selected in the Australian team, with Laura having the additional honour of being the team flag bearer. The Club wholeheartedly congratulates them on their achievements at the Games and their efforts over the entire competition season, especially Laura's win at the Aerials World Cup event at Le Relais, Quebec and Val's maiden World Cup Gold in the Snowboard Big Air in Edmonton, Alberta as well as the season's Big Air Crystal Globe. Val has also achieved the honour of being the first snowboarder to win World Cup medals in halfpipe, slopestyle and big air events in a single season. Congratulations also to Bentley Walker-Broose and Tuva Bygrave for their selection in national XC teams.

I would like to congratulate Judy Lejins on being awarded Honorary Life

Membership of the Club at the 2022 AGM. And I would like to congratulate Chrissie Young on being awarded the Lane Poole trophy in 2022. Congratulations also to all our other 2022 trophy winners. And huge congratulations to Peter Cunningham who was recently awarded the 2022 Snow Australia Service to Snowsport award.

I would like to pass my condolences on behalf of the Club to the families of the members and former members that passed during 2022. In particular I would like to note the passing of Victoria Peterson (Gold Member) and Les Powell (Associated Ex-member).

I would like to thank Perisher Lodge Coordinator Peter Richards, Jindabyne Lodge Coordinator Peter Cunningham, Franklin Coordinator Jenny McLeod and O'Keefe's Hut Coordinator Paul Obohov for their continued hard work throughout 2022. Many thanks also to Doug Boast who stepped in as Jindabyne coordinator while Peter Cunningham was temporarily out of action. I would also like to thank all the volunteers who attended work parties, and those who served as lodge leaders.

Thanks to Jill and Ken French, who continued their management of Perisher Lodge during Peak season, and provided additional support in relation to cleaning and other requirements. Thanks also to Judy Lejins (Editor) and Monika Binder (Assistant Editor) for the 6 editions of Frozen Acres produced during 2022 and to Jenny McLeod for creating and distributing 20 Skimail newsletters. I would also like to thank Public Officer Lindy Down.

Finally, I would like to thank all Committee members for their efforts over 2022, especially Vice Presidents Amanda East and Jeremy Lucas, Treasurer Will Comensoli and Secretary Jenny McLeod. While it is not possible to individually identify everything Committee members have contributed during the year, the ongoing viability and future success of the Club is heavily influenced by this group of volunteers and the Club is fortunate to have people willing to contribute their time and skills.

PART 2 - OPERATIONS

The Club's operations are directed generally by the Committee, assisted by sub-committees convened by Committee members.

FINANCES (Treasurer: Will Comensoli)

2022 Result

The club withstood a turbulent two years of COVID and in 2022 had a return to some normalcy, ending the 2022 season with a strong balance sheet and strong cash surplus that can be put towards capital works projects.

The club achieved an operating surplus of \$322,686 (2021: \$110,269). The surplus was recorded after providing for depreciation of \$86,996 (2021: \$85,865) and interest of \$1,707.14 (2021: \$4,555).

The result is extremely welcome, as it has allowed us to pay off the Jindabyne redevelopment loan many years early. The surplus this year was driven by strong bed night revenue as members sought to get back up to the snow after two years of restrictions. I am also pleased to see work parties are oversubscribed from new members hoping to join as well as current members. I encourage my fellow Committee to take advantage of this current spike in demand for work parties to best keep the lodges in working order.

Accommodation revenue for Perisher to \$328,167 (2021: \$187,090) and Jindabyne to \$180,941 (2021: \$108,133).

Overview of Key Financial Data

Our insurance premiums again skyrocketed to \$73,960 (2021: \$59,230). This is substantially more than our current member subscription revenue. We must now rely on good snow seasons and the club having good bed night attendance and bookings to pay our wages, rent and all other expenses.

National Parks Rental Charges reduced to \$35,532 (2021: \$50,742) reflecting deferrals paid in the 2021 year, however given record revenue levels I expect we will be hit with a much larger bill for 2023.

Cost centre net results, after allowing for depreciation and amortisation of \$86,996 and matching income and expenditure to the applicable year, are presented in the below table:

Balance Sheet

There was a net increase in cash held for the year of \$259,202 (2021: \$38,473) as the club has paid down the Jindabyne loan to \$5,000 and begun putting funds aside for the Capital Works Fund I have long dreamed of. Cash held at 31 December 2022 was \$483,939 (2021: \$224,737) of which \$177,328 is now set aside for future capital works.

Property values are included in the Balance Sheet at cost less accumulated depreciation. A new Valuation was conducted in 2022 which replaced the old 2007 valuations. The Perisher property was valued at \$7,890,000 based on replacement value (2007: \$1,920,000). The Jindabyne Lodge was valued at \$3,320,000. Note it is registered on the balance sheet at cost of \$1,434,133 less Accumulated Depreciation of \$301,842.

Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan

At 31 December 2022 the Club had paid the initial drawdown of \$1m down to \$5,000 (2021: \$120,000), after repayments of \$115,000 (2021: \$160,000).

The details of the Jindabyne Redevelopment Loan with Westpac bank are (at time of writing this report):

Inclusive of the 1.05% Facility Fee, the total cost of this finance is 6.38%.

We are required to reduce the principle on this loan by \$60,000 per annum going forward (2019 and prior years: \$91,000 per annum). This changed in June 2020 after executing a refinancing exercise to provide greater financial flexibility given the COVID-19 lockdown, and the clubs strong position with loan repayments heading into COVID-19.

In light of proposed capital works in the next few years, the Club will be engaging with Westpac or possibly another bank to refinance the loan facility to then have funds available to fund the proposed capital works should cash balances drop below working capital requirements. Cash requirements will vary depending on how quickly the club chooses to proceed on its various capital works projects.

Auditor

Mr Patrick Salter, Chartered Accountant, has provided an unqualified audit opinion on the Club's 2022 financial report.

Insurance Cover

The principal policies provide the following cover at each of the lodges:

The policy excess amounts are (generally) \$1,000. The policies provide cover to specific sub-limits for accidental damage, burglary, theft, and a range of other risks.

Persons representing the Club at sanctioned snow sports events or participating in Club events are generally covered under a policy maintained by Ski and Snowboard Australia. This policy also provides Public Liability cover of \$20,000,000, Professional Indemnity cover of \$2,000,000 and Management Liability cover of \$1,000,000.

The Club maintains a Voluntary Workers insurance policy which, in broad terms, covers members on and travelling to and from working bees. Workers Compensation insurance was maintained for NSW during the year to cover the employees of the Club.

GOVERNANCE (Convenor: Caroline Walker)

The Governance subcommittee has reviewed the Club's Constitution and intends to propose changes at the 2023 AGM dealing with remote attendance at meetings, raising the upper age of Youth Members, increasing the limit on the costs the Committee can commit the Club to without AGM approval, broadening the scope of the Club's objectives to include all snowsports rather than just skiing, updating the logo, and assorted other changes. The Governance subcommittee has also reviewed existing practices around delegations, reimbursements and budgets

General Meeting

The 2022 Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held at the Canberra Bridge Club on Wednesday 23 March 2022, as a hybrid in-person and online meeting. The hybrid format again worked well, with 35 attendees in person and a significant number participating via Zoom.

Committee Changes

Several Committee changes occurred at the 2022 AGM. Caroline Walker was elected as President at the 2022 AGM, replacing Jon Wilson, who did not re-nominate, and became Immediate Past President. Jeremy Lucas was elected as Vice-President. Monika Binder, Andrew Herring, Mandy Savery and Colleen Turner left the Committee, and Yvette Lejins, Mim Rihani, Cheryl Taylor, and Chrissie Young joined as Ordinary Committee Members.

LODGES (Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

Following the relaxation of Covid restrictions there were no mandatory closures of any lodge during 2022.

Because of the Club's decision to restrict capital expenditure to essential projects until the Covid pandemic impacts receded and the Club's financial position consolidated, primarily normal maintenance activities were conducted.

Perisher (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Richards)

Five work parties were conducted during 2022 with a good roll-up of willing hands at each one (19/20 February, 19/20 March, 7/8 May and 26/27 November). A weeding party was held on 9/10 January.

- The activities and improvements undertaken at Perisher during 2022 were installation of a new clothes dryer, erection of a stone wall at the front of the lodge, minor painting, completion of APZ tree clearing and clean-up and repair of a water leak in the bedroom wing connection..

Jindabyne (Lodge Coordinator: Peter Cunningham)

Three working bees were conducted during 2022 – 6/7 February, 7/8 May and 12/13 November and all were well attended. The main minor maintenance completed was internal painting and repairs

Mount Franklin (Coordinator: Jenny McLeod)

Work parties were held at Mt Franklin in January, April, and November. The April work party was a one-day work party followed by an ACT Heritage Festival Open Day the following day. The toilet block, or more specifically the pits, had a significant upgrade by NPWS early in the year, with tanks installed. This required the entire (heritage) toilet block structure to be lifted away, the pits and slab replaced, and the structure lifted back into place. Workparties concentrated on weeding and track clearing. The November work party started the work of clearing the track from the summit to the Austin, which has gradually narrowed over the years.

O'Keefe's Hut (Coordinator: Paul Oboohov)

The annual O'Keefe's Hut Workparty was held on 12 – 14 March 2022 (Canberra Day long weekend), with Paul Oboohov (O'Keefe's Officer), Amanda East, Shelley Cooper, Michael Griffiths, and Arthur Hitchcock. Several young families expressed interest, however following a KNP NPWS stipulation limiting participants to ten, and two four wheel drive vehicles, these families withdrew. The workparty completed the following work: painting wood oil on external faces of wooden beams under the corrugated iron roof, and on external sides of the cedar window frames, applied putty to a small missing section on the external frame of the north facing window, installed

more coat hooks on the walls of the rear room, and restocked wood in the wood box in the entrance room. We inspected the new metal box stove, with a flue going up the chimney, and fired it up during evenings, and found that its radiated heat raised the internal temperature of the hut, unlike an open fire where most of the heat escapes up the chimney. Michael had suggested the installation of such a stove. Paul and Amanda inspected the rear door, and found the wooden step had collapsed due to a rotten bearer and joist. Photos were taken, and Amanda later made a technical drawing, which were communicated to the NPWS via the Kosciuszko Huts Association. On the Sunday we drove to the only usable walking trail where the Tumut River begins on the western flank of the southern ridge, and Amanda, Shelley, Paul and Michael summited Mount Jagungal. On returning, a storm developed above the summit, out of blue sky, with rain and some lightning strikes on the flank below the summit as we got to the car. On the Monday, we took used bottles found in the hut and our own rubbish with us as we departed.

CAPITAL PROJECTS (Convenor: Peter Cunningham)

Perisher Basement Refurbishment Project

A Capital Projects sub-committee was formed to facilitate the Perisher basement refurbishment project. The sub-committee conducted seven meetings to progress the project with the following major steps achieved:

- Extensive member consultation including two members' meetings,
- Finalisation of a draft design
- Cost estimate in process of being obtained
- Structural engineers report completed
- Commenced preparations for a Development Approval (DA) to the NSW Department of Planning and Environment

There is a considerable amount of work to be completed with a target construction commencement date of October 2023. The main future steps will be final DA approval, builders quotations and appointment and Construction Commencement approval.

Concurrently we are progressing a modified DA for the dining room extension and kitchen refurbishment.

BOOKINGS (Convenor: Jon Wilson)

Lodge Usage

As can be seen from the figures reported in Appendix 2, 2022 was an outstanding year for the Club in terms of bookings, with both lodges significantly exceeding their highest ever occupancy rates. With 3,244 bed/nights, Jindabyne was 11% higher than 2018, the previous record. And with 6,346 bed/nights, Perisher was almost 50% higher than 2012.

While peak usage was at record levels, reflecting the demand from members to get back to the snow after several years of disruption, it is the increase in off-peak usage that really soared in 2022. This is a trend that the Committee would like to see continue, and will remain a focus in 2023.

Lodge utilisation remains incredibly important in maintaining the financial viability of the Club, as it provides the bulk of the funds that the Club needs to invest into maintenance, as well as capital improvements and renovations. The high levels of bookings in 2022 have also translated into high levels of revenue and profit, as can be seen in the financial reports.

Booking System

The Club has completed another year of operation with the CBDWeb system as its centralised membership and booking system. While the system continues to meet the majority of our needs, feedback indicates that members do find some aspects of the system frustrating. The Committee do welcome member feedback on this topic, and are looking at ways that we can improve this experience.

In 2022, the Committee introduced a new schedule for booking opening and cut-off dates, along with different tiers for confirmation. The purpose of these changes is to improve equity and access for members, while simultaneously reducing the administrative load for our Admin Officer. The Committee will monitor these changes throughout 2023, and welcomes member feedback on these changes.

Following rollouts to both Jindabyne and Perisher, the digital bunk list continues to work well, and member feedback remains positive.

Booking Privileges

A small number of members and guests were granted booking privileges (complimentary accommodation and early confirmation of Saturday nights) which

are approved by the Committee. A list of these is included in Appendix 3.

These privileges are typically extended to the coordinators of lodge events (such as Family and Youth Weeks, and the Brumby and Championship Dinners) as well as members representing the Club during races (e.g. Balmain Cup, Perisher Cup) and participating in Snowsports development programs.

The Club also supports Nordic Shelter work parties by offering complimentary accommodation to participants. We were proud to be able to continue our support of this community in 2022.

SNOWSPORTS (Convener: Mim Rihani, Club Captain: Sarah Brake)

2022 Events

The club has run and participated in several events during the 2022 season. The first event of the season was the Club Alpine and Snowboarding Championships on the 31st of July, which we opened up to Cooma Ski Club. It was a great success, and we are planning to host an annual CAC x Cooma race again in 2023. In the skiing, the female winner was Sarah Brake and the male winner was Will Brake. In the snowboarding the female winner was Mim Rihani and the male winner was Nathan Shepherd.

The KAC, which is run from Perisher to Charlotte Pass, is used as the XC Club Championships, and was held on the 8th August. Harriet Greville was the fastest female CAC representative and Tim Greville was the fastest male CAC representative. The Balmain Cup was held on the 3rd of September. CAC came 3rd overall across the 4 events, slalom, giant slalom, snowboard and cross country. CAC also entered a team in the Perisher Cup after a hiatus on the 17th of September, where we came 3rd in the Perisher Plate division.

Many junior Club members competed in the Interschools competitions at regional, State and National level, with some excellent results including a number of gold, silver and bronze individual and team medals.

Snowsports programs

The club actively supports the development of Snowsports by offering development grants and some complimentary accommodation to those who apply and are approved in accordance with the Snowsports guidelines. This process is undertaken by the Snowsports sub-committee.

Articles have been published throughout the season re-capping the Club races and other events as well as an outline of the season from snowsports development program applicants. See Appendix 5 for winners of Club trophies.

When members compete for the Club in events such as Perisher Cup and Balmain Cup they can seek reimbursement for any associated costs (lift tickets, gear hire etc) and also receive complimentary accommodation (see appendix 3). Information on development grants is available on the Club website.

Elite Competition Level

Two athletes were awarded Elite Competition grants – Laura Peel (Aerial skier) and Valentino Guseli (Snowboard).

Laura started 2022 with a World Cup win in Deer Valley, with a score that would have put her on the podium in the Men's event. Due to the final aerial competitions being cancelled as a result of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, there were no Aerial World Cup Events following the Olympics in Beijing. After finishing 5th at the Beijing Winter Olympics, Laura finished the 2021/22 competition season ranked 3rd. She has had a bit of a mixed bag for the 2022/23 competition season. Laura competed in two water ramp events in Mettmensstetten, Switzerland and Park City, Utah. In both of these she achieved a 2nd place. The on snow competition started in Ruka, Finland on the 4 December, followed by two Europa Cups the next weekend. In these events she came in 4th and 3rd respectively.

Generally there would have been another competition in China before Christmas but this year that did not happen so there was a long break until the second and third World Cups in La Relais, Quebec on the 21 & 22 January 2023. On the 21st she fell on landing and came in 10th but on the 22nd she jumped beautifully and won with a massive score of 109.15. At the time of writing, Laura is ranked 3rd in the world.

Valentino also competed at the Beijing Olympics early in 2022, coming 6th in the Half Pipe in an excellent Olympic debut, after a (then) personal best 5th place in the Laax World Cup. His first World Cup podium was in Georgia, with 2nd in Slopestyle, and followed that up with 3rd in Switzerland, again in Slopestyle. In December he won his first World Cup, taking gold in Canada in Big Air. In early 2023, Val became the first rider in FIS Snowboard World Cup history to earn podiums in all three Park & Pipe events (Half Pipe, Big Air, and SlopeStyle) in one season. At the time of writing, Val is ranked in the top 10 in all three disciplines – Half Pipe, Big Air, and Slopestyle.

SOCIAL (Convenor: Cheryl Taylor)

Club Social activities for 2022 recommenced in earnest once the lifting of COVID restrictions made group events possible in an unrestricted environment.

The annual “Pre-season Social” made a return and was held indoors, in the cosy warmth of Maddies Library at the Kingston Hotel on Sunday 14th of May. The relaxed atmosphere allowed members, new & long term, young & old, to catch-up over a quiet drink and partake of some delicious bar snacks.

During Cross Country ski week we had an impromptu “shared nibbles” evening at Perisher Lodge on Monday 8th of August. Here we helped feed the appetites of members and guests as well as the tired competitors after the KAC Classic. Any members, and guests, on the mountain, or at Jindabyne Lodge, were welcome to sample the large charcuterie boards set out in the lounge area. It was a lovely evening, a nice reward after a hard day’s mountain activity!

However, the highlight and most rewarding event both to organise and attend was our Post-Season Presentation and Picnic, held on Sunday 30th October. A wonderful turn out of over 55 members, past and present, came together to congratulate 2022 trophy winners and enjoy picnic fare. The alternate “wet weather” venue at Corroboree Park, Ainslie was perfect for our group. It was comfortable inside, the kitchenette allowed space for food preparation plus the covered hall area was ideal for holding the presentation. In addition the park with BBQ outside allowed people to spill out on to the grass and playground area beyond. Perfect, as the afternoon continued to be sunny!

As we look forward to 2023, Social Sub-Committee would welcome any members, new or old, joining in the fun and offering their help or suggestions.

MEMBERSHIP (Convenor: Jenny McLeod)

Membership has increased again this year, with a net increase of seventeen members taking it to a total of 576 across all membership categories. However there was a large increase in the number of people on the waiting list, which jumped from 66 to 101. Many of these are expected to progress to membership in early 2023, which may bring membership numbers to the limit of 600. The ratio of “out of area” members is also now very close to the limit of one third.

Statistics on membership numbers are in part 3 of this report.

Judy Lejins was elected as an Honorary Life Member at the 2022 AGM, in recognition of her contributions to the Club, in particular as editor of *Frozen Acres*, social organiser of Perisher work parties, and other contributions.

PUBLIC RELATIONS (Convenor: Jenny McLeod; Frozen Acres editor: Judy Lejins; Assistant Editor: Monika Binder)

Significant progress has been made in 2022 on a branding overhaul of the Club, including several new logo options which were presented to members for feedback and a vote, and development of a new website, which is expected to go live in 2023. Thank you to Jeremy Lucas for leading this work.

With Frozen Acres now being published bi-monthly, six issues were printed and sent out to members during 2022. While most of the copies are emailed to members by Jenny McLeod, 50 are also posted to members who have opted to receive them as a booklet. Thanks to Jon Wilson who batches and posts these.

As Skimail gives timely information to members on important club matters and coming events etc, Frozen Acres has concentrated more on articles about activities undertaken by members, both in the Snowy mountains, and in alpine resorts in many other parts of the world, as well as club social events in Canberra. Interesting articles too were included about work parties at our lodges and at Mt Franklin and O'Keefes hut. A number of photographs were sent in with these articles adding interest to each of our issues.

Stella, our former Admin Officer, continues to proofread most articles with Assistant Editor, Monika, and Cheryl Taylor proofreading them when Stella was unavailable.

FreshCreative continue to print each copy after Monika has checked the mock-ups.

Thanks to those members, adult, youth and juniors, who have provided contributions.

20 Skimails were sent in 2022; thankfully, these concentrated less on COVID and more on events this year! As well as social gatherings, they also advertised member forums to discuss basement redevelopment at Perisher, races, and updates on the achievements of our elite athletes, among many other items.

The Club's Facebook group was another way of providing updates to members, and with 180 posts made during the year, it was well-used by members to discuss issues, report snow conditions and race results, post some excellent photos, and of course keep up with the Olympics! although COVID restrictions at times were changing faster than we could provide updates! It was also used to celebrate achievements and share clips of athletes such as Laura and Val. The group has over 330 members.

Business cards with basic information and contact details for the Club are still available, as are Club logo stickers.

The Club again had an information stand at the Snowsports Sale and Expo in May, with plenty of interest from attendees.

The Club's Personal Locator Beacon was borrowed six times in 2022, for Mt Franklin work parties and for private trips. The PLB is available for loan to any member at no cost for bushwalking, skiing, or other expeditions, in order to improve safety for members on Club or private trips.

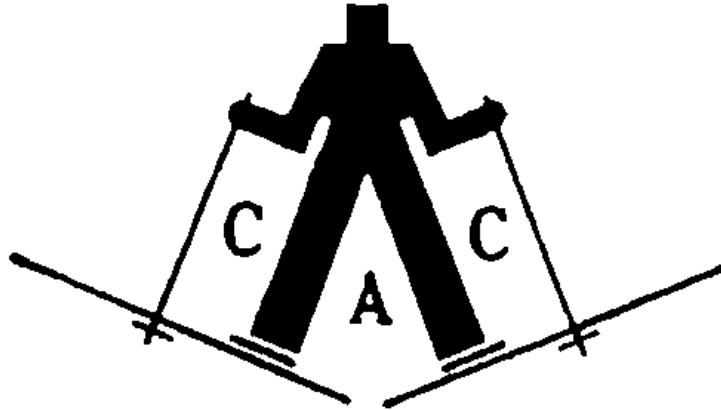

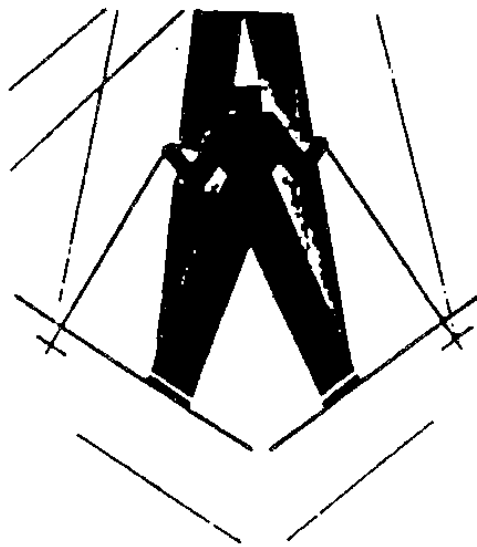

THE CLUB BADGE

The distinctive Club badge is quite unlike the badges of more recently formed ski clubs and is typical of the skiing era in which it was designed.



The original badge design, shown above, appeared in December 1936 on a brochure explaining the objects of the Club 'to the citizens of Canberra'. According to the Club's foundation Treasurer, Mr J.C. Anderson, it was adapted from the design, shown below, which appeared on the dust cover of the 1935 Ski Year Book. That design is attributed to a Mrs de Gruchy, who was said to be a member of the Ski Club of Victoria.



This original design changed after some time to a blue diamond with the skier herring-boning in yellow, thus utilising the then national colours, which have also been those of the Club for many years. These colours were adopted by the Territory upon obtaining self-Government (but ceased to be the national colours in the 1980s when the unofficial sporting colours of green and gold were formally adopted by the Commonwealth).
